

Johns professional career has spanned some fourteen years to date of which almost seven years has been spent on the 'Westend' Stage in Cabaret and Musicals such as 'Underneath the Arches' (Prince of Wales), 'Wizard of Oz' (RSC at the Barbican and Stratford) 'Talk of London' and 'Cockney Revues' and 'La Cage Aux Follies' (London Palladium) other theatre work includes Bobby Van Hussen in 'The Boyfriend', 'My Fair Lady' (Theatre Royal Plymouth), 'Abracadabra' (Windsor and Plynouth), also many Revues and Pantomine Seasons Work includes 'A Night of 100 Stars', 'Love Story', 'Halls of Fame' and the Olivier awards.

As well as stage work John is Co-Director in 'Casino Hire' the production company that has travelled 'La Cage Aux Follies' worldwide with productions in Frankfurt (Germany) Tuscan Arizona (USA) and all over the UK. The most recent production being the Grand theatre Wolverhampton which John Directed and Choreographed to huge critical acclaim. It is direct from that project that John has joined Newcastle AOS to produce and Choreograph 'Kismet', another challenge with many new found friends - making this a very special production at Hanley's Theatre Royal.

The Story of Kismet

Kismet takes place over a period of one day in Baghdad around the year 1100 AD. We are first of all transported to the steps of the Mosque just before dawn where we hear the Muezzins call the faithful to prayer. There are beggars on the street and a penniless public Poet trying to make a living from an unresponsive populace. The Poet's daughter, Marsinah is his assistant and he learns by accident that curses have more effect than charm. He also takes on the pitch of old Hajj who is off to Mecca and in that guise is abducted by Jawan the Brigand to answer for a curse placed on Jawan by Hajj many years ago. He is rewarded by 100 pieces of gold for promising to remove the curse.

The Poet has a slick tongue that in turn lands him in deep trouble and then talks him out of it.

In the Bazaar of the Caravans we learn that the Wazir has been granted a loan to get him out of his current financial trouble provided that he arranges for the Caliph to marry the three Princesses of Ababu. Meanwhile the Caliph, in disguise, sees Marsinah and falls immediately in love with her, he follows her to a garden where they arrange to meet later, she thinks he is a garderner.

The Poet finds himself arrested by the Wazir's Police for possessing stolen goods, and is taken before the Wazir's court for sentence, where Lalume takes a fancy to his fanciful tongue, and she helps him convince the Wazir that he is a Wizard able to perform magic. In order to obtain his full services the Wazir promotes the Poet to the rank of Emir and offers him full free use of his extensive but little used Harem.

When the Caliph returns to the garden he just misses Marsinah and returns to the Palace to enlist the help of the Wazir to find her, something that couldn't be further from the Wazir's mind, in the meanwhile Lalume has offered Marsinah safety in the Wazir's Harem, somewhere he would never dream of looking, but while he is giving the Caliph a conducted tour trying to push the charms of the Ababus he comes across Marsinah by accident. The Caliph thinks that she must be one of the Wazir's wives, who says nothing to disallusion him and then proceeds to put the record straight retrospectively. The Caliph holds his reception in order to choose a wife and the Poet learns of the 'marriage' of his daughter to the Wazir, and in a complex double plot succeeds in bringing justice on the Wazir, reuniting the Caliph and Marsinah and to get a sentence that enables him to spend the rest of

Our 15th production here at the Royal is KISMET based on the melodies of Boradin and telling of the events over one day (Dawn to Midnight) in ancient Baghdad. We welcome into the company a newcomer, April Davies, who is playing Marsinah, the Poet's daughter, along with the welcome return of David Bryan, who plays the Poet. Virginia Bryan is playing the wife of wives to the Wazir, Lalume, whilst the Wazir is in the care of a welcome return of John Steele. Andrew Talbot completes a very strong principal cast by playing the young Caliph whose search for a wife brings all the chracters together.

We are sure that with this strong cast plus the excellent and inspired choreography and direction of John Cumberlidge together with Chris Keen's Musical direction you will be well pleased and entertained by this marvellous musical gem.

The Theatre Royal is owned by a Charitable Trust and administered by Potteries Theatre (Management) Ltd.

General


The management reserves the right to refuse admission and to make any alteration in the cast or programme which may be rendered necessary by illness or other unavoidable causes.

In accordance with the requirements of the City of Stoke-on-Trent Council:

- (i) The public may leave at the end of the performance by all exits and such doors must at all times be open.
- (ii) All gangways, corridors, staircases and external passageways intended for exit, whether permanent or temporary, shall be kept entirely free from obstruction.
- (iii) Persons shall not be permitted to stand or sit in any of the gangways intersecting the seating, or to sit in any of the gangways. If standing be permitted in the gangways at the sides and rear of the seating, it shall be limited to the numbers permitted by the council and indicated by the notices exhibited in these premises.
- (iv) The fireproof safety curtain to the proscenium opening must be lowered and raised at least once during every performance or entertainment to ensure its being kept in proper working order.
- (v) No smoking shall be permitted to take place on the stage except as part of the performance.


