Jane Eyre...

Jane Eyre delivers the biggest thrill of any Broadway musical this season. Standing out from a crowd... "Jane Eyre," like its heroine, shines with rare sensibility. This is a musical for grown-ups: spare, somber and rich, with an absorbing story and lyrical score...

Jane Eyre is a haunting retelling of the Charlotte Brontë classic about an orphan girl who grows up to become the governess of Thornfield Hall. Directed by James Freeman and with Musical Direction by Allison Fisher, NOS brings this absorbing Broadway Musical to the Stoke Repertory Theatre for an intimate one week run. Jane meets and falls in love with the enigmatic Edward Rochester, an Earl with a dark secret. The musical Jane Eyre is filled with soaring melodies and a romantic lyricism uncommon in the modern Broadway musical. Jane Eyre is a sweeping love story, breath-taking in its scope and beauty.

The novel goes through five distinct stages:

- Jane's childhood at Gateshead, where she is emotionally and physically abused by her aunt and cousins;
- her education at Lowood School, where she acquires friends and role models but also suffers privations;
- her time as the governess of Thornfield Manor, where she falls in love with her Byronic employer, Edward Rochester;
- her time with the Rivers family at Marsh's End (or Moor House) and Morton, where her cold clergyman-cousin St John Rivers proposes to her;
- and her reunion with and marriage to her beloved Rochester.

Partly autobiographical, the novel abounds with social criticism. It is a novel considered ahead of its time. In spite of the dark, brooding elements, it has a strong sense of right and wrong, of morality at its core





Musical Director


Allison Fisher studied music at Glasgow University and The Royal Scottish Academy of Music, specialising in piano and voice, before becoming a music teacher in Scotland. She took part in concert work around the Glasgow area for several years before moving to the Midlands in 1985. Since then, Allison has been involved in amateur productions, firstly as a soloist with Cannock Operatic Society, playing parts in shows such as 'The Sound of Music' and 'Carousel' followed by many leading roles with the Leekensian and Centenary Operatic Societies in their productions of Gilbert and Sullivan Operas. Her skills as a pianist also led her to being involved with North Staffs, Porthill, Liberty and Newcastle Operatic Societies in several of their productions and concerts. Since giving up stage work, Allison has been Musical Director for many of the Gilbert and Sullivan Operas in which she once took part, as well as more modern shows such as 'West Side Story', 'Annie' and 'Grease'. She is also the Musical Director of the North Staffs Christian Choir, the U3A 'Singing for Pleasure' group in Leek and Fusion Theatre Company in Stoke. She has thoroughly enjoyed the challenge of bringing the music of 'Jane Eyre' to life for this production.

James has performed as an actor for several societies across Staffordshire, in venues ranging from Stafford Gatehouse to Little Morton Hall and The Royal to Trentham Gardens, as well as for Radio Stoke.

He regularly performs in productions for Stoke Repertory Theatre Players, most recently as John Merrick in 'The Elephant Man' and Lord Windermere in 'Lady Windermere's Fan'.

Favourite previous roles include Raleigh in 'Journey's End', Mozart in 'Amadeus', Oswald in 'Ghosts', Rodrigo in 'Don Carlos' and Donal in 'Days of Wine and Roses'.

Previous directing credits include 'The Murder of Maria Marten' (Stoke Rep), 'Separate Tables' (Stoke Rep), 'Cash on Delivery' (Newcastle Players) and 'Humble Boy' (Stoke Rep).
