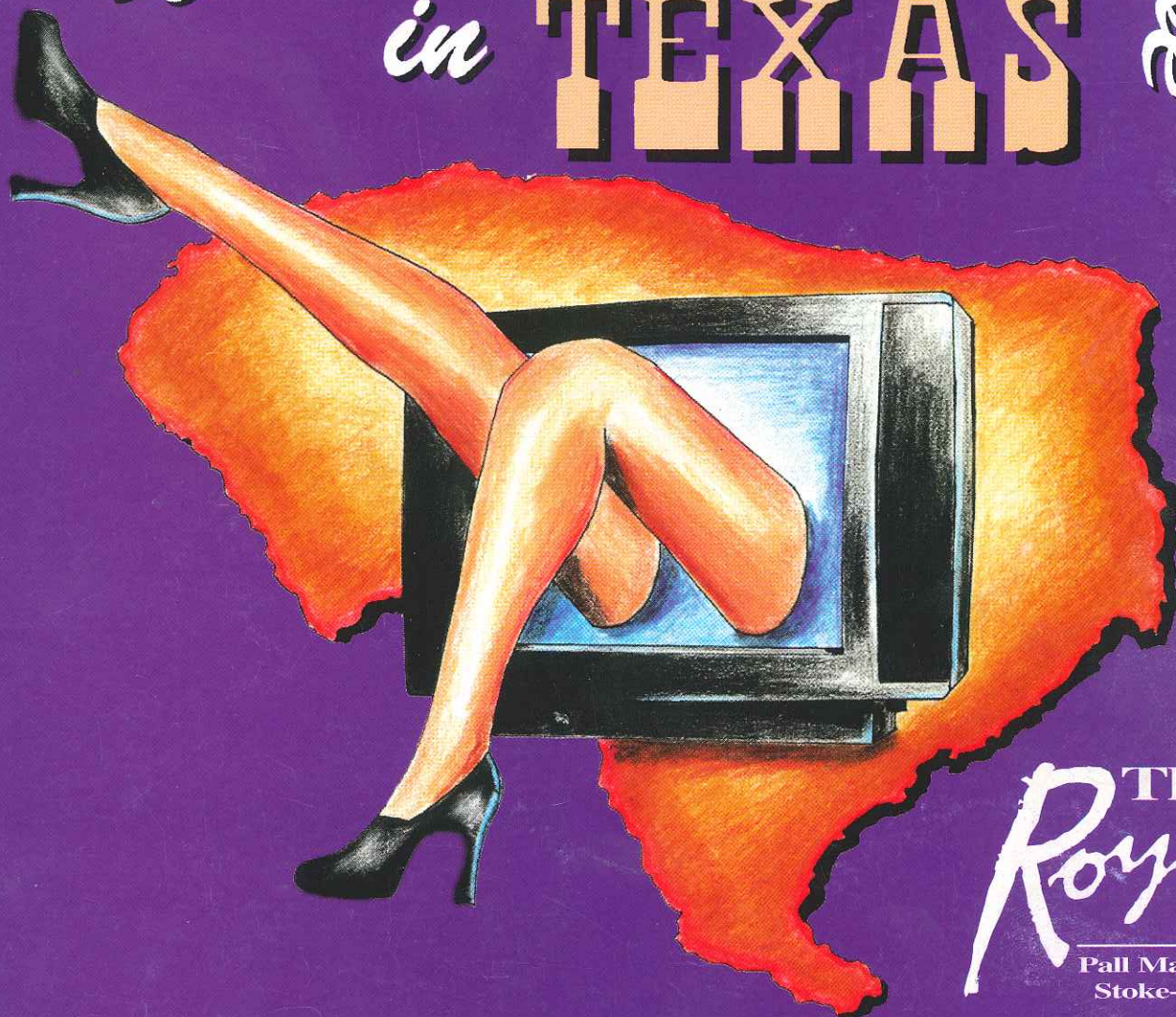

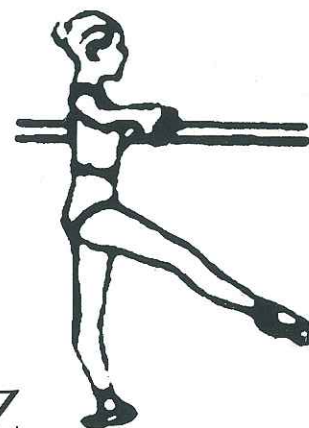

President's & Chairman's Message

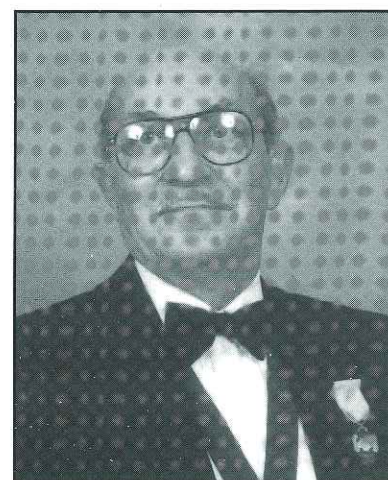

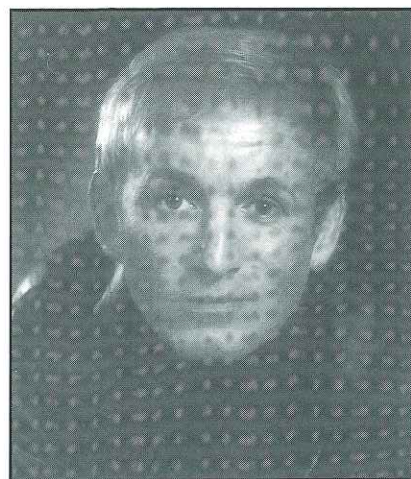

John Cumberlidge

Director & Choreographer

John's professional career has spanned some eighteen years to date, of which almost seven years has been spent on the London Westend stage in cabaret or musicals, such as Underneath the Arches (Prince of Wales) Wizard of Oz (RSC at the Barbican and Stratford) La Cage aux Folles (London Palladium), Talk of the Town and Cockney Revues. Other theatre work includes Bobby van Hussen in The Boy Friend, My Fair Lady (Plymouth Theatre Royal) and Abracadaver (Windsor and Plymouth), also numerous pantomimes and revue seasons with many 'star' names. Television work has included Love Story. A Night of 100 Stars, Halls of Fame and The Olivier Awards. In recent years John has directed many musicals, including Follies, Kiss me Kate, Guys and Dolls,

Crazy for you, La Cage Aux Folles, and the award winning 'Me and My Girl' gaining him, the best director's award at 1st International Festival of Musicals in 1997.

The summer of 1999 will again see John tutoring the musical performance course at the N.O.D.A. summer school at Warwick University, and he is the first director since the original London production to workshop the Andrew Lloyd Webber, Tim Rice musical "Evita"

The Best Little Whorehouse in Texas - Background Story

After many years of 'service' to the local community, or to be exact, to certain sections of the community, in the little town of Gilbert, Texas, the 'Chicken Ranch', as the town's whorehouse had come to be known, is almost regarded as a local institution.

The owner, Mona Stanglely, has continued to run the Chicken Ranch along the strict lines of lady-like conduct laid down by her predecessor Miss Wulla Jean. Her required high standards together with her close friendship with the local sheriff, Ed Earl Dodd, are instrumental in maintaining the position of the Chicken Ranch in the town. Things would have probably gone on like that for many more years but unfortunately the Chicken Ranch comes under the focus of Melvin P. Thorpe, the self-styled T.V. Watchdog, who has made his reputation by sniffing out scandal and corruption and who now becomes determined to run the Chicken Ranch out of business.

The town becomes divided on the issue with Sheriff taking Mona's side. However his very outspoken defence, captured on film and broadcast on T.V. News, does little to help the cause of Mona and the Chicken Ranch.

Other personalities, including local Senator Wingwoah and the Texas Aggies University football squad, become involved particularly when a night-time raid on the whorehouse by reporters and cameramen catches some prominent people literally with their pants down. This gives Melvin P. Thorpe a notable coup.

The matter now gets referred to the Governor of Texas for action but, in true political fashion, he tries to sidestep the issue.

So, is this the end of the trail for the good old Chicken Ranch?

Musical Director

After graduating from the Royal Manchester College of Music (now the RNCM) in 1968, one of his first professional gigs was at the Macclesfield festival as a jazz pianist on the bill with Acker Bilk. Now a free-lance musician, he is in great demand as an accompanist and lecturer at several colleges and universities which he combines with his theatre work.

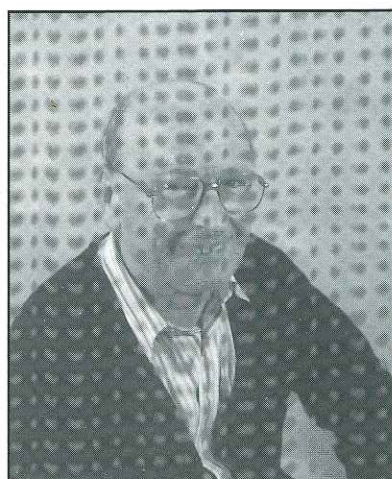
Sue Hargreaves

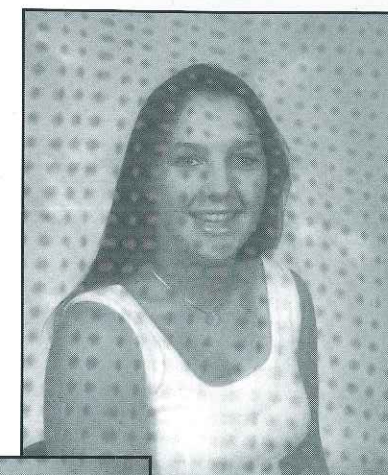

Melvin P. Thorpe

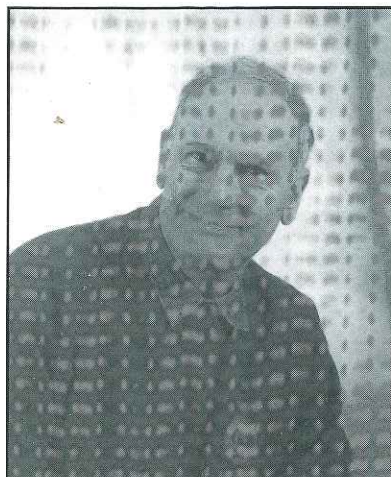

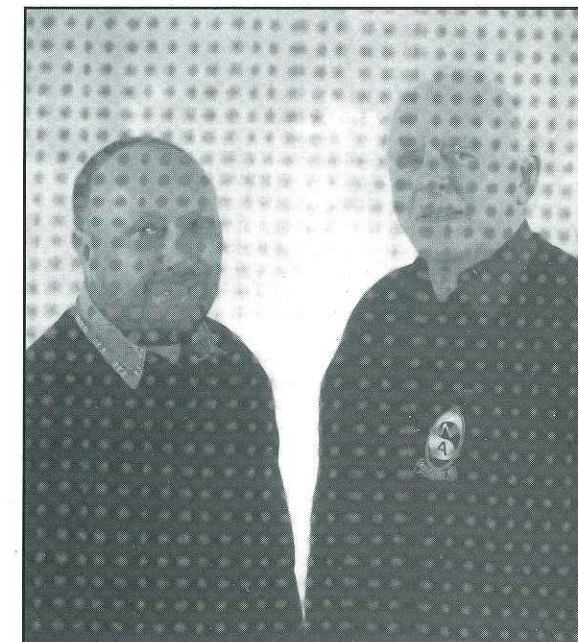
Scruggs and Edsel
