Gordon is well known in local theatrical circles, having taken a leading role in the development of local theatre and youth talent.

Since Gordon's last production for N.A.O.S, Gordon has been involved in professional theatre and television. Gordon made his West End debut at The Dominion Theatre in 'Bread', and since then has starred with such luminaries as Albert Finney, Tom Courtney and Nigel Havers in various West End productions and national tours including: 'A Passionate Woman' and 'Art'.

TV roles include: 'Coronation Street', 'Heartbeat', 'Hetty Wainthrop Investigates', 'Emmerdale', 'Casualty' and 'The Bill', as well as a role in the TV film 'A Good Thief'.

This is the first time Chris has taken the role of Musical Director for N.A.O.S, although he has assisted with rehearsals in the past. Chris has been the Musical Director of many local amateur shows in the 70s and 80s including productions by Studio One, The Rep, Stoke Youth and Screamline.

More recently Chris has been a co founder and Musical Director of a local charitable concert group, who include his wife Jennie. By pure coincidence they are called 'The Sounds of Music'! As well as performing locally the group travels all over the country and has presented more than £20,000 to a variety of charities.

Recent retirement has given Chris time to pursue his many hobbies including: model railway, golf, video photography, and of course music!

For over the last 20 years, Greg has been a stalwart of local theatre, taking such leading roles as Frank Butler in 'Annie Get Your Gun', Tony in 'West Side Story', Joseph in 'Joseph and his Technicolour Dreamcoat' and Anatole in 'Chess' to mention just a few.

Greg is a seasoned cabaret performer, and has performed in numerous plays with companies such as Studio One and The Rep.

Greg has choreographed many productions throughout the North Midlands and N.A.O.S are delighted to have him on board for 'The Sound of Music'. Greg has also directed for various Scout Gang and other Youth shows and is currently working with 'Our Gang' Congleton Scouts.

The Story: Maria, a postulant in a Salzburg Abbey, is distracted from her religious duties by the majestic alpine landscape, her restless, passionate spirit and her love of music.

The Mother Abbess, believing that Maria's personality may not be suited to Abbey life sends her away to try and discover her true calling. Maria is to be governess to the Von Trapp family- a brood of seven children helmed by Captain Von Trapp, a widowed naval officer who educates his children with military discipline.

Maria quickly learns that she is the latest in a long line of governesses who have been scared away by the antics of the seven children, who are incorrigible pranksters. Ignoring the Captain's instructions for stern discipline, Maria wins over the children with her natural warmth and kindness. She fashions them play clothes from curtain cloth, encourages them to play and teaches them to sing- and they respond to her care with happiness and laughter.

Together, Maria and the children entertain the Captain and his guests, Baroness Schraeder, the Captain's new love interest and Max Detweiller, a friend of the family. At a party designed to introduce the Baroness to the Captain's friends, the Captain and Maria dance together the Austrian folk dance, The Laendler, and both realise they have fallen in love with the other.

Maria, being confused about her feelings and believing this to conflict with her desire to become a nun, leaves the household and returns to the Abbey. Maria confesses her love to the Mother Abbess, who tells Maria to return and face her love.

On return to the Von Trapp household Maria discovers that the Captain and Baroness are due to be married. However, all is not roses with this relationship, and when the Captain discovers that the Baroness' views about the impending Nazi annexation of Austria differ dramatically from his own, it is clear that the wedding cannot proceed. The Baroness leaves and Maria and the Captain are finally free to marry.

Whilst the Captain and Maria are on honeymoon, the Anschluss takes place and the Nazis occupy Austria. At the same time, Max who has been captivated by the children's singing has entered the children into the Kaltzberg music festival.

On return from honeymoon, Captain Von Trapp discovers that he has been called into military service for the Nazis, an appointment, which his conscience will not allow him to take. However the Nazis are not prepared to discuss the matter, and soldiers arrive to ensure the Captain's compliance.

In order to avoid involvement with the Nazi regime, a plan is drawn up for the family to escape to nearby Switzerland under cover of the festival...



Background to the Story

The Sound of Music is based around the true-life story of Maria Rainer, a postulant at the beautiful Nonnberg Abbey, near Salzburg, Austria. Maria had entered the abbey after completing the Austrian State Teachers' Course. On instructions from the Mother Abbess, she travelled to the Villa Trapp where she taught the children of widower, Captain Georg Von Trapp. Von Trapp had been a distinguished naval commander, and after his wife, Agathe died, Von Trapp was left alone with his children.


When Maria arrived, the children were already musically inclined, as was Von Trapp himself, however she brought about a sophistication to their music that resulted in the Von Trapp Singers becoming household names in Austria.

Maria and the Captain were married, and after the Anschluss in 1938, the family left to find a better life in America. Von Trapp died on 30th May 1947, although Maria and the children continued performing until 1956. Maria died in 1987 and was buried next to her Captain at The Von Trapp Family lodge in Vermont, USA.




